Battle of the Brains Trivia Challenge

Competitors filled 43 tables during this year's Battle of the Brains Trivia challenge, an annual benefit for the Education Foundation of Muskogee. The challenge featured six rounds of six questions each, plus a "mulligan" question for each round.

The Advantage Controls team took second place. "We came for blood," said Dan Morris, who joined fellow competitors at a front table. "We are the trivia masters of Muskogee."

Morris said he and other teammates took first at the Foundation's 2014 Trivia Challenge and third last year. They also won five Muskogee Rotary Club trivia contests in a row, he said.

"I read Wikipedia cover to cover before I came," said team member Jeff O'Neal. O'Neal said his specialty is "13th-century Japanese literature."

Morris, president and chief executive officer of Advantage Controls, said he recruits members "based on triviology." He said he is well versed in history and geography.

Foundation President Alice Adair said the Foundation sold out all 43 tables this year. She said teams bought two tables at \$1,500 each, seven at \$1,000 each and the rest at \$500 each. That means the foundation raised \$27,000 from tables alone, Adair said.

Even more money was raised through a live auction and a silent auction of cakes, cupcakes, pies and other baked goods.

Money raised Friday would help cover costs of class programs. Looming state funding cuts weigh heavily on the Foundation, she said. "With the expected shortfall next year, it's even more critical to fund schools," Adair said.

Muskogee Schools Superintendent Mike Garde called the Trivia Challenge an excellent fundraiser.

Shiver in the River

For the third consecutive year, Advantage Controls has participated in the Shiver in the River plunge that benefits Muskogee County Council of Youth Services (MCCOYS). Each year, a few employees dress up in costumes and take the icy plunge at Three Forks Harbor in Fort Gibson. 
